N THE MARCH 2021 NEWSLETTER, I INFORMED MEMBERS OF OUR COMMITTEE'S PROPOSAL TO INCORPORATE OUR ASSOCIATION UNDER THE NSW FAIR TRADING ACT. JUST TO REMIND MEMBERS, INCORPORATING AN ASSOCIATION PROVIDES AN ASSOCIATION WITH ITS OWN LEGAL IDENTITY APART FROM ITS MEMBERS.

I mentioned in the last newsletter that incorporation gives legal protection to a member acting on behalf of the association. I gave an example where either the newsletter editor or webmaster published an article that offended or allegedly breached copyright. In response, the offended person or business could take legal action. Incorporation means that the legal action would be against the association, not the individual member (in this example, the editor or webmaster) of the association.

I also mentioned that the association gives a legal entity for us when dealing with public and private organisations.

A proposal to proceed with incorporation went before the March General Meeting. It would be reasonable to say that members had a few questions about incorporation. Questions were around the cost of public liability insurance, the public officer's role and responsibilities, and whether it was necessary for an association of our size to consider incorporation.

I mentioned earlier a public officer. The Incorporation Act will require us to have a public officer who must be over 18 years of age and reside in New South Wales. The primary roles for a public officer are:

- notifying Fair Trading of any change in the association's official address within 28 days
- collecting all association documents from former committee members and delivering the documents to the new committee member
- returning all association documents to a committee member within 14 days upon vacating office
- the official contact for the association, including taking delivery of documents served on the association
- custody of any documents as required by the association's constitution.

We meet between 12 and 12.30pm at the club.



Going home from Springwood tpwards Central, the first practical departure from **Springwood to Central leaves at 1.54 pm**, stopping at these main stations; **Penrith 2.24 pm**, **Blacktown 2.40 pm**, **Parramatta 2.50 pm**, **Strathfield 3.02 pm**, then **Central 3.15 pm**. **Later departures** are at **2.36 pm**, **3.00 pm**, **3.30 pm and 4.00 pm**.

Going home to the west of Springwood a train departs Springwood at 1.37 pm, then arrives Katoomba at 2.17 pm and arrives Lithgow at 3.05 pm. Other trains departures from Springwood to Katoomba are at 2.37 pm and 3.37 pm. Finally a train leaves Springwood at 3.37 pm for Katoomba at 4.17 pm and arrives at Lithgow at 5.05 pm





Dine & Discover NSW



■ HE FOLLOWING ARTICLE REMINDS RMA MEMBERS THAT THE NSW GOVERNMENT HAS LAUNCHED "DINE & DISCOVER NSW".

Members who have a "MyServiceNSW" account can apply online or via the Services NSW app on their smartphone. In my case, I received an email from Services NSW advising of the vouchers and encouraging me to apply online. I completed my application via my smartphone. I then had the vouchers on my Services NSW app within two hours.

If you already have a "MyServiceNSW" account, log in and go to the "Highlights" on the website's opening page. Find "Dine & Discover NSW" towards the bottom of the page, select and you will find details about the vouchers and the option to apply online. After you have read the details, at the bottom of the page is a button for you to apply online.

Please note the online application will not allow you to proceed unless you already have a "MyServiceNSW" account. However, the application form will provide an option for you to create an account. Once you have application approval, you find the vouchers under the "Vouchers Section" on your smartphone app for Services NSW. If you cannot apply online, you can call 13 77 88 or visit a Service NSW Centre with your proof of identity documents (two proof of identity documents such as your NSW driver licence, Medicare card, Australian passport).

The vouchers on your smartphone have a Q-code for the business to scan. If you are without a smartphone, you can print the vouchers.

Vouchers

- 2 x \$25 Dine NSW Vouchers for dining in restaurants, cafés, bars, wineries, pubs or clubs.
- 2 x \$25 Discover NSW Vouchers for entertainment and recreation, including cultural institutions, live music, and arts venues.

You can only use the Dine NSW vouchers with a participating NSW business. You can view a participating business online. Another essential point, if your bill is less than \$25, the remaining balance is given up and cannot be used later. Here the option is to share your voucher, perhaps when paying your bill or be prepared to go over the \$25 and pay the balance.

Finally, the vouchers are not just for seniors or concession holders; they are available for all NSW residents over 18. The voucher scheme will end after the 30th June 2021.



THE PSALM OF LIFE

On Wednesday, 14 April 2021, around 25 of our members did a very interesting tour of the historic Sydney Trades Hall. The two guides did a great job explaining the history of the heritage-listed building and told many stories of what has gone inside the building since it opened in 1895.

When we got to the library, we found they had dug out early Tele-Technician newsletters from the archives. Many of you will remember reading Tele-Technician at work (it was published nationally). Following is a poem from one of the war-time newsletters

Tele-Technician Vol XXV, No5 24 June 1942 Official Journal of the Australian Postal Technicians' Union

THE PSALM OF LIFE

(Tele-Technician' Version)

Tell me not that 'Phones and numbers Makes our lives a pleasant dream; Faults, alas, our slumbers, And subs. are not what they seem.

Lives of great men all remind us We must test on Loop and Leak; And departing, leave behind us Finals that will Ring and Speak.

Preselectors that work truly, Groups that hunt like busy bee, Ringers that run sweet and coolly, Valves that function to a "T".

Maintenance and Installation, Both our services require. Lift the voices of the nation Farther yet, and even higher.

Not great wealth nor yet great glory Do we get for our reward; Never in an epic storey Do the scribes our deeds record. Braid-less are our shabby dustcoats, Neither stars nor crowns have we; Not for us to sink the U-boats, Nor high deeds of chivalry.
